

EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

Little Spiral is the perfect book for promoting nature and environmental awareness, as well as introducing children to the idea of endangered species. Key themes also include bravery and exploration.



DISCUSSION TOPICS

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- 1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about? Do you know what a spiral is?
- 2. Have you visited a forest like the one in the story? What was it like? Did you see any of the animals from the book there?
- 3. Why do you think the author wrote a book about Little Spiral?
- 4. Explain what the word 'endangered' means to the children (a species which is seriously at risk of extinction). Extinct means that the species no longer has any living members.
- 5. Do you know about any other animals or birds that are endangered?
- 6. Why do you think certain animals and birds are endangered? (The main reason species become endangered is loss of habitat, this can occur naturally but is more often caused by human interference).
- 7. What do you think people should do if they know an animal or bird is endangered?
- 8. Despite being so small, Little Spiral is determined to explore the forest. Do you like exploring the outdoors?
- 9. Explain the concept of the story coming full circle, the story starts and ends with the forest snail egg.
- 10. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?


