
# TEACHING NOTES: PLAY BALL


#### ABOUT THE AUTHOR/ILLUSTRATOR

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#### **EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY**

Play Ball is a fun story celebrating the idea that sometimes what looks like a problem can, in fact, become a new, exciting opportunity. Playing ball on your own can be a lot of fun, and the young penguin in the story finds lots of creative ways to play with a ball – until the ball goes missing. What looks like a problem, quickly becomes a new opportunity to have even more fun. Key themes are resilience, perseverance, friendship and opportunity.

#### **DISCUSSION TOPICS**

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- 1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. What does the penguin like to do with the ball? Can you think of any other actions you can do with a ball?
- 3. Name all the places where the penguin looks to try and find his ball.
- 4. Where does he find the ball? Why does this present an exciting opportunity?
- 5. Talk to the class about how sometimes things go wrong and events/situations don't turn out as planned. But then, they can turn into wonderful opportunities. Discuss the idiom, 'When one door shuts, another opens.'
- 6. Ask if they think that *Play Ball* is a good title for the book. What other titles can they think of?
- 7. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?




