EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

DISCUSSION TOPICS

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- 1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. How does the girl in the story feel when her friend, Otto, gets caught up in plastic?
- 3. Have you ever seen plastic on a beach or in the sea? How did it make you feel?
- 4. What does the girl see after she rescues her friend, Otto?
- 5. Why do you think that she is so upset?
- 6. What does she decide to do?
- 7. Talk about the character change in the girl. At the beginning, she is quite shy but then changes and becomes determined and resourceful.
- 8. Do you think the girl makes a difference?
- 9. Why is it a problem to have so much plastic in the sea/ocean? What can be done to get rid of the plastic?
- 10. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?

ACTIVITY: DESIGN A POSTER

In the book, the girl in the story is committed to saving the ocean.

On the next page, have a go at designing your own poster to raise awareness about the importance of keeping our oceans clean.

Here are some questions and things to think about when making your 'Save our Ocean' poster.

What types of plastic are found in the ocean?

Why is this happening?


What is being done now to protect the ocean?
