
# THE MIRACLE OF THE GREY SWANS



#### **DISCUSSION TOPICS**

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- 1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. Ask the children if they've ever seen a swan before? In what setting?
- 3. How would you describe Weiwei? Curious? Determined?
- 4. Have you ever studied a bird or animal over a long period of time? In your garden or in the local park? What did you notice? Did you write anything down or maybe draw pictures in a journal?
- 5. Talk about the connection between Weiwei's family and the swan family. How does this develop throughout the story?
- 6. What is Weiwei's father's role in the story?
- 7. How do you think Weiwei feels at the end of the story? Happy? Sad?
- 8. What have you learnt about swans in this story?
- 9. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?



Weiwei stood by the lake, watching the injured swan, feeling hopeless. Reaching for his bamboo pole, he tried to hook the injured swan and help it to shore, but the pole was too short. The injured swan flopped its good wing with all its might—it did not like. Weiwei's searching pole. Meanwhile the other swan rushed over and bit on the pole with its bill, swinging its neck with force and snatching the pole from Weiwei's hold. With one final flip, it threw the pole back onto the shore.

Weiwei was shocked. He didn't expect the grey swan to be such a tough warrior.

'Of course, this is just their temporary nest. Later on, they are free to make their own choices. To stay or to go, it's their decision.' His father smiled.


Weiwei then turned to his mother. 'Since we're eating, it's probably time for mother swan to eat too. But what are we going to feed her?"


