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EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

The Garden Monster is a delightful adventure story about two brothers trying to look for a

monster in their garden and meeting a whole host of garden creatures along the way. The book explores the themes of sibling fun, teamwork, curiosity and determination. The charming, playful rhyming verse encourages language and memory development.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- 1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. Ask the children if they have adventures in their garden. With their siblings or their friends? Have they ever been on a hunt for something? A treasure hunt, maybe?
- 3. What animals and creatures do the two boys meet along the way? Have the children seen all those creatures in their garden or backyard?
- 4. Do the boys ever meet the monster? Who is the monster? Is the monster real?
- 5. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?

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
